CHANGE IS GOOD! I'm not sure who coined the term "change is good" but I like it.

Think back for a minute about everything we changed in 2017. We basically re-made our entire company. We changed how we operate, all our revenue and equipment codes. How we plan and how we price. We successfully joined TSMT into SLT and then became Tri-State. We added new customers to help run our trucks over the weekends. And we continued to tune everything.

And what has all this change brought us:

- We thought hitting \$1.8 million a week was great but now we hit \$2.1 million on a lot of weeks.
- We run over 500,000 loaded miles almost every single week.

• We grew our DOD freight by 100%.

Do you know that in the first 2 weeks of December 2017 we generated \$600,000 more dollars of revenue than we did during the same time frame in 2016 with basically the same size fleet?

What caused us to change? It all came from listening to you guys, hearing your frustrations, seeing that we were struggling to communicate, struggling to function as a team, struggling to hit our revenue goals. All this frustration created an atmosphere where each person couldn't succeed. It didn't matter how good our people were because they couldn't win the game. I've been in this business a very long time and I have never seen so much change in one year. We are an amazingly different company today and I truly appreciate everyone's support through all the change.

So what does 2018 look like? The big news is we have new ownership with Daseke and they have told us to grow as much as we want and they will fund it. We have a sister company R&R and they would like the two of us to join forces to be the biggest and the best AA&E carrier in the business.

So we have a lot to do but the great news is we've built a solid foundation. We have a great group of people that have been there through all the changes. And we've have built great processes that will allow us to successfully grow and successfully change.

Their point was it easier to focus on things in your life that aren't good for you personally or professionally and put those things on your Stop Doing List and focus on them.

Driver Q&A: QEPermit

Q: My QE Permit came in, now what?

A: Once you have your QE Permit IN HAND please take a picture of the permit and Drive Axle it in to tsmtbilling@roadmastergroup.com. Then follow up with a phone call to Theresa Porter or Michael Fisk to confirm. At that time if you have both your US Passport and your QE Permit and are eligible to receive the bonus it will be processed.

Q: I have applied for my QE Permit but have not received it yet. What can I do?

A: The first question to answer is has it been at least 2-4 weeks since the application was submitted? If no, then please be patient. If yes, then you may follow up your submission by emailing the QE Office at: explosifs@surete.gc.ca

Q: I don't have my QE Permit yet, but I got a letter requesting a background check. What do I do now?

A: Call Theresa Porter or Leah Groom. Most likely we already have a copy of your background report and can help.

DELISH~di'liSH

Christmas Crack Dip

Ingredients:

1/4 cup diced jalapenos (I use jarred jalapenos – the type you use for nachos)

10 slices of bacon

1 8 oz. package cream cheese

1/2 cup sour cream

½ cup mayo

1 tsp garlic powder

1 cup shredded pepper jack cheese

1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

¾ cup shredded parmesan cheese

Topping:

1 cup Panko bread crumbs



4 tbs. butter, melted

1/4 cup shredded parmesan cheese

1 tbs. fresh parsley

- Preheat the oven to 375 degrees
- Fry bacon until crisp, then drain and crumble. Take out a couple of tablespoons of the crumbled bacon to add to the topping.
- Combine the cream cheese, sour cream, mayo, and garlic powder in a mixed bowl and mix on medium speed until fluffy.
- Add pepper jack cheese, cheddar cheese, parmesan cheese, crumbled bacon and jalapenos to the cream cheese mixture and mix well.
- Spread into an 8x8 baking dish.
- To make topping, combine bread crumbs, melted butter, shredded parmesan cheese, crumbled bacon and parsley.
- Sprinkle the topping over the cream cheese mixture.
- Bake 15 to 20 minutes or until hot and breadcrumbs are golden brown.
- Serve with Ritz crackers or tortilla chips.
